Draw or print out a picture of something that happens in the story. Add speech bubbles to the characters and tell me what they might be saying.

The adjectives used to describe the tiger are 'big', 'furry' and 'stripy'.

Make a list of some more adjectives you could use to describe the different characters in the story.

Work with the people in your house to act out the story. You could give the different characters accents.

You could watch some videos of the story to get some ideas.

Imagine you are the tiger. Write an apology letter to Sophie and her family for your greedy behaviour.

Try to keep your writing in the past tense.

Imagine you are Sophie explaining to Dad what has happened. What might you say?

Write 5 sentences explaining to dad what has happened. Remember expanded noun phrases.

E.g. The enormous, orange tiger knocked on the wooden door.
