







Welcome to the Spring Reading Newsletter



The Year 6 children felt so inspired and couldn't wait to get reading and writing!


Each of Maz's books are available to borrow in the school library.

Look out for more information to come about how we will be joining in with this annual celebration of authors, illustrators, books and the joy of reading here in school.






Recommended Reads





